He <b>boasted about being</b> better than me. He <b>complained to me about my</b> never tidying up. He <b>denied stealing/ having stolen</b> the car. He <b>insisted on me/ my wearing</b> warm clothes. He <b>suggested going</b> to the theatre.</p>

"I know the answer." "You never listen to me." "I've never spoken to her." "It's wonderful!" "It's an easy recipe to follow." "You will be called for an interview." "I won't lie to you again." "You ought to take the other road."</p>	<p>He <b>agreed that</b> it was a beautiful hat. He <b>boasted that</b> he was a brilliant dentist. He <b>claimed that</b> he knew the answer. He <b>complained that</b> I never listened to him. He <b>denied that</b> he had spoken to her. He <b>exclaimed that</b> it was wonderful. He <b>explained that</b> it was an easy recipe to follow. He <b>informed me that</b> I would be called for an interview. He <b>promised that</b> he wouldn't lie to me again. He <b>suggested that</b> I take the other road.</p>

<p><b><u>Wonder where/ what/ why/ how + clause</u></b> (when the subject of the introductory verb is not the same as the subject in the reported question)</p>	<p>He asked himself, "How can she reach the top?" He asked himself, "Where is Joan." He asked himself, "Why is she crying?" He asked himself, "What is she doing?"</p>	<p>He <b>wondered how</b> she could reach the top. He <b>wondered where</b> Joan was. He <b>wondered why</b> she was crying. He <b>wondered what</b> she was doing.</p>
<p><b><u>Wonder + whether + to- inf or clause</u></b> <b><u>Wonder where/ what/ how + to- inf</u></b> (when the subject of the infinitive is the same as the subject of the verb)</p>	<p>He asked himself, "Shall I buy that car?" He asked himself, "Where am I going?" He asked himself, "What should I tell her?" He asked himself, "How can I fix it?"</p>	<p>He <b>wondered whether</b> to buy that car/ he should buy that car. He <b>wondered where</b> he was going. He <b>wondered what</b> he should tell her. He <b>wondered how</b> to fix it.</p>
